









# Beware of falling on the floor

Almost 20% of all workplace accidents in Belgium are due to falling. That is why we would like to give you an insight into some of the risks:

### The biggest causes:

- 1. Tripping
  - Objects lying around such as toys and shoes.
  - Blocked passages
  - Insufficient lighting
  - An uneven surface with e.g. loose tiles or a difference in height
  - Pets
  - Carpets with curled-up edges
  - Electrical cords'
  - Wrong shoes or loose laces

### 2. Slipping

- A polished or wet floor
- A slippery bath or shower room
- Small carpets that slide easily

### The biggest risks

- 1. Wet or uneven floor
- 2. Smooth or loose carpets
- 3. Weather conditions (e.g. ice, snow)
- 4. Insufficient lighting
- 5. Loose cables or objects lying around
- 6. Clutter (e.g. boxes, paper, rubbish)
- 7. Distractions (e.g. reading, mobile phone)
- 8. Unsuited shoes

## Possible consequences

- 1. Injuries
  - Scrapes
  - Bruises
  - Sprains
  - Fractures
  - Internal bleeding



- Absence for a short or longer duration
- Permanent injuries

Keep it tidy.	
<ul> <li>Clear away objects lying around (toys, shoes, clothes)</li> <li>Put everything in its place. The terrace, garden and garage should also be tidy.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Clean up any spills immediately.</li> <li>Ensure that passages are and remain unobstructed while you are working.</li> </ul>
Keep passages clear.	
<ul> <li>Do not leave shoes in front of doorways.</li> <li>Take pets to a safe place.</li> <li>Always provide sufficient lighting</li> </ul>	Do not leave your equipment lying around and clean up everything immediately after use.
Wear appropriate footwear	
<ul> <li>The housekeeper must wear her Safety shoes while working.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>No loose laces!</li> <li>Do not walk around in your socks or stockings.</li> <li>Wear the safety shoes you were given in the JobCenter.</li> </ul>
Be attentive to the floor.	
<ul> <li>Maintain floors, carpets and stairs regularly so that they do not become loose and can pose a risk.</li> <li>Inform your housekeeper of known risks in your home.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Watch out for cables, an uneven surface, loose tiles, carpets</li> <li>Do not step on freshly polished floors that are still wet.</li> </ul>
Take into account weather conditions	
Provide a carpet where your housekeeper can wipe their feet in wet weather.	Be extra careful in wet weather. Dry your shoes well     when entering the house to prevent them from
