









Working with cleaning products

General guidelines:

- Use only products that are in their original packaging and have a readable label.
- **Never mix** different products yourself.
- Ensure that the housekeeper has **gloves** available.
- Preferably purchase **liquid cleaning products** and avoid buying sprays and aerosols.
- Have the housekeeper open a window in the room where he/she is cleaning or ensure that the ventilation **system is active**. This refreshes the air and dilutes the vapors from the products.
- **Clean the cloths and mops** after each cleaning session.
- **Unsure about a product?** Take a photo of the label and send it to safety@daoust.be.

The following products should not be used by the housekeeper:

- Products without warning symbols on the label.
- Products with the **following symbols**:



GHS07

These products may be irritating or may have minor harmful effects.

Always read the label carefully and apply the conditions of use indicated on it.



These products are flammable and may catch fire when in contact with a flame or heat source.



These products are especially dangerous for the environment. So don't pour them down a sink or sewer.



These products may not be used by the housekeeper:

• Products with the **following symbols**:







These products are toxic.

- Products with the following risk phrases:
 - o H314 Causes severe burns and eye damage.
 - o H317 May cause allergic skin reaction.
 - o H318 Causes serious eye damage.
 - o H336 May cause sleepiness or dizziness.
 - o EUH208 Contains < name of sensitising substance >. May cause an allergic reaction.
- Specific products:
 - o Ammonia
 - o Javel
 - o White Spirit
 - o Hydrochloric acid and other corrosive products
 - Toilet unblocker
 - o Acetone or washing alcohol
 - o Ether and other industrial products
 - o Home-made products (customer-made mixtures)

In case of emergency - First aid

- Product on skin or in eyes: rinse with plenty of water.
- If swallowed: drink plenty of water (do not vomit).
